- ❖ **There is no easier, safer, quicker or more affordable way to leave your home to someone or for someone to leave their home to you. That's why Colorado passed the Beneficiary Deed Law. CRS 15-15-402.**
- ❖ **Under Colorado Law, a Will requires your home or any other Colorado real estate to go through probate. This deed keeps your home and other real estate out of probate.**
